

Interview Guidelines



TIPS: As there will not be an interviewer present to ask you these questions, to make it easier for the viewer to understand your answers, why not incorporate or repeat the questions in your answers and make it interesting.

For Example:

Q: What are your Hobbies ?

A: My hobbies are *keeping fit, I enjoy swimming, I've recently achieved my bronze in life saving, I am hoping to enter a 5k charity swim in a few months. I also enjoy reading, my favourite author is... etc*

Rather than: I like keeping fit, swimming and reading ... !

QUESTIONS YOU SHOULD ANSWER

1) Start your video with YOUR NAME , AGE & WHERE YOU ARE FROM.

Example: Hello my name is 'John' , I'm 19 years old and I'm from London

2) Explain a little about yourself, Are you a student ?, Are you currently working or in-between jobs ? etc.

3) What are your Hobbies or What do you like doing in your spare time ?

4) Why would the viewer Hire You ? , Do you have any unique skills ?

5) What are your biggest strengths ?

6) What would you consider as your weaknesses ?

7) What are your greatest achievements and What are you most proud of ?

8) What would be your dream job and why ?

9) How would your co-workers / colleagues or current boss describe you ?

(If you have just left full-time education and this is your first job then describe how you think your friends and fellow students see you)

10) What is it you are looking for in a job ?

11) If you are currently working , Why are you seeking to leave your current employer ?

12) Have you experienced any challenges / pressure or conflict in your current role, and How did you overcome or handle it ?

13) Where do you see yourself in 5 years ?

14) If an employer were to hire you, What would you contribute, What could you bring to the party ?

Should you follow these simple yet comprehensive questions, you will streamline the interview process. 90% of the questions above have appeared in interviews in most industries.

Try to keep it engaging, don't be afraid to be yourself or show your true personality. You won't often get a second chance to make a first impression. So why not read through the questions and record your interview several times, then upload the best version or, if you have the skills, then why not select your favourite bits and edit them together.
